# MAKE A VIKING HELMET!

#### You will need:


- > A piece of A2 cardboard any colour of your choice (I used silver as I had it available)
- > A4 White cardboard
- > Scissors
- > Strong glue
- > Felt-tip pens




### How to make it:



- **1.**Cut 2 long strips from the bottom of the A2 sheet of card. Cut one of the long strips in half so you have 3 strips.
- 2. Roll the longest strip into a ring big enough fit around your head and fix with the glue. Glue the other 2 strips into a cross shape. Glue each end of the cross into the inside of the headband. This is the base of your helmet.
- **3.** On the white piece of A4 card draw 2 large horn shapes and cut them out, fold over a small tab on the bottom of each horn and glue them onto your helmet.





**4.** Using the remainder of your coloured card, draw and cut out around 10 small circles. Glue these onto various places around the base of your Helmet.

Set one aside to draw your own Viking crest or symbol on, something that tells others what kind of Viking you are. Glue this special circle right on the front to finish your Helmet.

# MAKE SUPERHERO WONDER-CUFFS!

#### You will need:

- > A toilet roll
- > A length of ribbon or string
- > Felt-tip pens
- > Scissors
- > A hole-punch



#### How to make it:

1. Take the scissors and cut the toilet roll open lengthwise and then shape one end of your flattened toilet roll into a triangle. Either using the hole-punch or scissors punch 4 holes, 2 on each side of your flattened toile roll, one on the top and one on the bottom.

2. Take your pens and decorate your flattened toilet roll. Have a good think about what superpowers you would have or what kind of Superhero you would be an incorporate this into your design. The more colourful your cuff, the stronger your powers will be.





**3.** Take your ribbon/ string and thread it through the holes in your cuff, lacing it up like a shoe. Put the cuff on and tie up your lace to make sure it won't fall off mid-flight and you're ready to save the world!
