# **Harvest Worship**

We are organising our first post Covid 'performance' to a live audience on the last day of this half term. Years 1 and 2 will be putting on a 'Harvest' production for which they have been rehearsing songs and practicing lines. The production will take place at 1.15pm in our school hall and we will be

issuing just the one ticket per child (this is due to space in the hall and keeping things as safe as we can given the current climate).

Children will be released for home straight after the production - at 2pm. Children in the rest of school can also be collected early on this last day of half term. Children in Years 4 and 6 however, due to Swimming and externally taught Art lessons, will be released at the usual time of 3.15pm. We will film the production and make it available for everyone to see it after the event. It will not be zoomed live due to the manageability of this.

# Covid-19 Signs / Symptoms and Protocols

We recognise that there are an awful lot of mixed and confusing messages out there about the symptoms of Covid-19 that we need to look out for and take action. For Hill Top, we are using the Bradford guidelines, which state the key symptoms are:

- o Fever (temperature of 37.8 °C or higher) and/or
- o new, continuous cough and/or
- o loss or change in normal sense of smell or taste (anosmia)



If any of our children display any of these symptoms in school or have displayed any of them at home, it is essential that they should stay at home and arrange for a test.

### How to access testing

If you have symptoms, either log on to <a href="www.nhs.uk/coronavirus">www.nhs.uk/coronavirus</a> or call 119 if you have no internet access.

## Hygiene

- Wash hands more often than usual, for 20 seconds, using soap and water
- For coughs and sneezes: catch it, bin it, kill it
- Avoid touching eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands
- Clean and disinfect regularly touched objects and surfaces more often than usual using standard cleaning products

Adequate ventilation in schools is essential, and this means leaving doors and windows open. As the autumn has now kicked in, we do encourage children to wear extra layers - Hill Top fleeces are the preferred option - we would prefer children to wear plain fleeces and not ones with sporting logos.

We are continuing to manage Covid cases as carefully as we can and whilst we still continue to have regular cases, we remain very appreciative of parents and their response to us requesting PCR tests for close contacts. Getting this right for every case causes us no end of worry and angst I promise you - and we are learning something new or having to consider something new every time we have a case.

### Shine Time Assemblies

Although we had planned Shine Time Assemblies as if we were living in a non Covid world, our current restrictions linked to our Risk Assessment means we will not be inviting parents into school at the moment (our first trial is the KS1 Harvest) - we will continue to review this as we look at the Covid cases at both national and local levels.



We can however hope.....and we have set some dates for Shine Times etc. this term - please do not get cross with us if we feel we have to cancel - if we do have to cancel it will be with heavy hearts but we will be cancelling with the intention of keeping the whole Hill Top community safe. So the provisional plan is to continue with our special Class Shine Time Assemblies on Friday mornings from 9.00am through to 9.30am. Each class will be hosting special assemblies to share work they have been doing in class in an entertaining way. As we used to do, you will be invited back into your child's classroom where you will be invited to stay up until 10.30am. During this time, you will be able to see your child at work and speak to the class teacher about his / her targets. Shine Time dates are as follows:

Fri 12th Nov - Year 4 - Shine Time Fri 19th Nov - Year 6 - Shine Time

(If we are not inviting parents into the school building at this time - we will Zoom the 'Shine Times' to enable you to watch from your devices)

Other classes will be having special Open Mornings for parents on the following dates: Fri 5<sup>th</sup> Nov - Year 5 Open Morning

## Weekly Awards

As you know, weekly, we distribute a whole host of awards...Child of the week, Tidiest Classroom, Attendance Cup etc - all of which are enthusiastically received. As a Church school, we will also be presenting our Christian Values Award, in the form of a small cross that can be worn on the collar / lapel of a polo shirt. This award will be given to children who have demonstrated in how they behave the

particular Christian Value we are focusing on in school in each particular term. This term we will be looking at 'Friendship" and will be exploring what this means and how we can demonstrate it in our everyday lives.

Flu Immunisation


This was due to happen on Monday 4th October, but was postponed due to NHS staffing shortages. I am calling on a daily basis to reschedule without much luck which is frustrating as we know as much as you how important the flu vaccine will be this year.



#### Free School Meals

Whilst we know that all children in Reception and Key Stage 1 are entitled to a free school meal this is known as the Universal Free School Meal offer - it is very important that they, as well as the parents of any Key Stage 2 children, still register via the Bradford Council Website if you receive:

- Income Support
- Income Based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit with an annual income of less than £16,190, provided they are not receiving Working Tax Credit
- the 'Guaranteed' element of the State Pension Credit
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 (you will need to apply directly to the school or call the Education Service on 01274 439393)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit with an annual net earned income threshold of less than £7,400
