

Outbreaks of Covid in School



Although numbers of Covid across school seem to have peaked, they still remain high across Bradford - we still urge you to be as vigilant as possible during the next few weeks - I am daring to think that we could be over the worst.

We still have staff members who are ill and / or self isolating at the moment and this continues to compromise the running of our school.

New Reception Area / Build

We were hoping that our new reception area would have been completed by now - this too has been impacted by Covid amongst the contractors as well as delays in some materials arriving. We are hopeful that this will be completed externally in the next week or so.





School Attendance

We are very proud of our school attendance record - Hill Top children have historically been good attenders, and despite the challenges of the last few years, this remains the case for the vast majority of our families.

We have introduced new initiatives this term to encourage children to be punctual and have the best possible attendance.

This involves all children who have 100% attendance in any given week being given a raffle ticket that goes into a draw for a class attendance prize at the end of each half term - all children have the capacity to be in this draw.

We have also reintroduced our 'Dazzle Boxes' - a much sought after gift box of brand new books which will be presented to the class with the highest attendance each half term. Well done to Year 2 who won last terms Dazzle Box and thank you to the PFA who are part funding the cost of each half terms Dazzle Box.

Some families will have received attendance letters last week where their child's attendance is of concern (Covid absence is not taken into consideration) - we are happy to discuss these in more detail and offer support where needed.
