## This term's Christian value is.....Peace



## The Lodge



As more parents and carers have changed their working day patterns, following Covid, we were just not getting the numbers into The Lodge to make it sustainable. We were in fact running it at a loss - it was never meant to make money for school, only pay for itself, but unfortunately, it is becoming more and more reliant on heavy subsidies from school, which we can no longer afford.

We are so sorry about this and hope you understand the position we are in. I am happy to discuss the decision with affected parents.

We will try to ensure that our after school club offer are extended further with a wider range of after school clubs, but this will not happen overnight but please be aware that many of the clubs we will be able to offer will finish at 4.15/4.30pm.

## Shine Time Assemblies



Following wider opening up of the country following the pandemic, this term we will be continuing with our special Class Shine Time Assemblies on Friday mornings from 9.00 through to 9.30. Each class will be hosting special assemblies to share work they have been doing in class in an entertaining way. Previously, after Shine Time, parents were invited back into their child's classroom where they were

welcome to stay up until 10.30am. During this time, you were able to see your child at work and speak to the class teacher about his / her targets. We are not quite ready for this to happen again just yet, but we would like to think that before the summer this is possible. We know how much both parents and children enjoy this time. Shine Time dates are as follows:

Year 6 will be performing a much anticipated end of year production at some point during the week beginning Monday 18<sup>th</sup> July - the exact dates will be confirmed as we have them.

### Platinum Jubilee Week

We are having a full week dedicated to celebrating our Queen's Platinum Jubilee the week beginning Monday 23<sup>rd</sup> May.

The week will include each class taking on a different decade linked to the Queens years on the throne.

We will be working with a Dance Company called Dance Days who will be teaching our children a range of dances from the decades including:

50's - Rock 'n' Roll
60's - The Twist and Mashed Potatoes
70's - Disco
80's - Fame
90's - Line Dance
00's - Street/Pop

Our children will also be working alongside our Patron of Reading, Conrad Burdekin (poet and children's writer) to create poems about our Queen.

Along with special art work, songs and a Jubilee Parade on the last afternoon (Friday  $27^{th}$  May) from 1.15pm (bikes, scooters and prams decorated in red, white and blue) and to which you are all invited, we will also be having a fancy dress day (Thursday  $26^{th}$ ) where children will dress up in clothing linked to their decade. Class teachers will be in touch later this week with ideas and suggestions and to inform you of the decade that their class will be given.

# Nursery Places

## SATs and other Assessments

The week beginning 9th May is an important week for our Year 6 children who will be sitting their national end of Key Stage 2 SATs, the results of which go on to their secondary schools. They are more than ready for these SATs and we are all confident

that once again the children's results will be as outstanding as they always are. The SATs for our Key Stage 1 children will be more staggered throughout the month of May.

Year 1 will be involved in a Phonics Screening Test and Year 4 will also be involved in a Multiplications Test in June.
